About Lima

Lima is the capital of Peru. Lima was founded in 1535 and in a short period of time became the most important city in the Americas. Today, there are more than eight million inhabitants, and the city shelters immigrants from all corners of the globe, which has transformed it into a mixed city par excellence. In the historic centre, placed by UNESCO on the World Cultural Heritage List, you can visit splendid samples of Colonial architecture like the Cathedral, the Convent of Santo Domingo, and the Convent of San Francisco as well as fantastically wood carven balconies. Lima is also an inexhaustible source of culture, demonstrated by the existence of numerous and varied museums like the National Museum of Archeology, Anthropology, and History and the Rafael Larco Herrera Archeological Museum, which guards priceless Incan and pre-Incan treasures.

Situated in the heart of the city are great archeological monuments such as the Huallamarca Huaca or the Pucllana Huaca. And, on the outskirts of Lima facing the ocean is Pachacamac, the most important pre-Incan sanctuary on the coast, built in the third century A.D. Some of the other great attractions are the beaches where you can do all types of aquatic sports, enjoy the sun, or simply gaze at the mesmerizing beauty of the Pacific Ocean.

During this trip, you must also remember to sample one of the best cuisines in the world. The city offers a wide variety of restaurants and inviting locales where you will be able to taste delicious dishes, the result of the mixing of European, African, Asian, and Andean cuisines.

Transportation

Lima is well connected with most cities in [South America](#). There are regular flights to [Ft. Lauderdale](#), [Miami](#), [Newark](#), [Atlanta](#) and [Houston](#) in the US. There are daily flights from [Amsterdam](#), [Madrid](#), [Miami](#), [Bogotá](#), [Medellín](#), [Quito](#), [Santiago de Chile](#) and [Toronto](#) . There are also good connections by [TAM Airlines](#) from São Paulo in Brazil.

Lima is connected by highway to every country that borders Peru.

You will arrive at the Jorge Chavez international airport

http://www.lap.com.pe/lap_portal/ingles/index.asp located at 20 minutes from de city, at Callao Constitutional Province. Departure taxes are US\$28.10 for international and US\$6.05 for domestic flights.

It is highly recommended to take a pre-paid taxi at the airport or request the hotel to arrange an airport pickup. If you want to contract a pre-paid taxi you must make it at the taxi company counters before leaving the airport parking . This service costs from 35 to 50 nuevos soles (between 12 and 18 USD) and it depends how far your hotel is located.

For transportation to the university you have two options.

(1) The organizers will provide a shuttle bus service covering all recommended hotels (excluded Melodia Hotel which is at 15 minutes walking). If you stay at one of the recommended hotels, this is the best option. The cost of this service is included in the meeting fee.

The schedule for this service will be

- 8:00 a.m. pickup from the hotel, go to the university.
- 5:30 p.m. back to the hotel.

2) Go by yourself

A taxi from Miraflores to the University is between 10 and 13 Nuevos Soles (USD 4) If you decide to stay at another hotel you can go directly to the university by yourself or if you prefer you can go in the morning to one of the recommended hotels where you can take the shuttle bus service.

Citizens of the United States and Canada

Citizens of most Central American countries (exception Costa Rica, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama)

Citizens of all South American countries

Citizens of all countries within the European Union and Switzerland

Only citizens of South Africa

Citizens of Brunei, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Taiwan

Citizens of Australia and New Zealand

Money

24-hour ATMs are available throughout Lima. There is a bank in the international arrivals area at the airport which is open 24 hours. Other *casas de cambio* (foreign-exchange offices) are found on Camaná in central Lima and along Larco in Miraflores.

Climate and clothing

Lima's climate is quite mild, despite being located in the Tropics.
